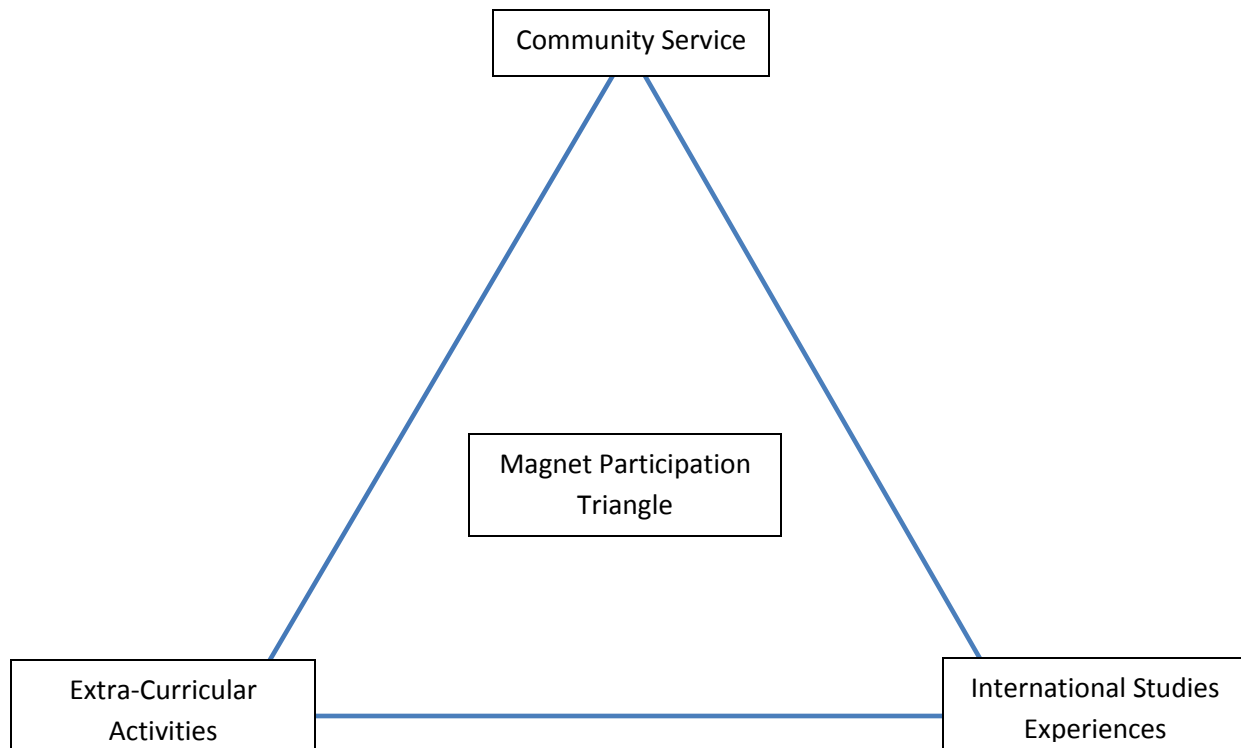




Magnet Participation Triangle

At North Cobb IS Magnet, we believe that students need to be involved in their campus and their community. Our Magnet students participate in extracurricular activities on our campus, give back to their community through service, and take advantage of the wealth of IS-related activities that the Atlanta area offers.



The following requirements must be met each year:

- 1. Community Service**
- 2. Extra-curricular activities**
- 3. International Studies Experiences**

Community Service: Minimum of **two community service activities**. Students document their community service hours and *submit them to the library or interdisciplinary lab*. North Cobb High School (not the magnet program) awards graduation medals to any student who documents:

- 100 hours for a bronze medal
- 150 hours for a silver medal
- 200 hours for a gold medal

The magnet coordinator will consult the library’s list to confirm that students have completed their two community service activities each semester. **No forms go to the Magnet office.**

Extra-curricular Activities: Minimum of 1 major activity + one minor activity each year.

International Studies Experiences: Minimum of 2 per year.
